
Thurs 3rd March - Drop everything and read


Will believes that for kids to learn about money, it needs to be fun and engaging.


A. F. Harrold, author and poet The Book of Not Entirely Useful Advice


Martin Brown, author and illustrator



Super Silly Museums





Wed 9th March - Serena Patel

Serena Patel, author of the 'Anisha, Accidental Detective' series Years 3 - 6, from 09:30, 1 hour sessions One school

Serena will start her visit to your school with a 45 minute 'Meet the Author' session for a whole year group or even a whole KS2 assembly. She will talk about how she became an author, her inspirations and her top tips for aspiring authors, as well as how the series came about and what's coming up next. This will then be followed by three one-hour creative writing workshops, which are suitable for one class at a time (i.e. 30 children in each workshop, 90 children in total) and will include a reading and Q&A. There is a choice of workshop theme:

Silly Stories - finding humour in the everyday, and how you can draw from your own life in your creative writing. Mysterious Mysteries - discussing what makes a good mystery and the importance of red herrings, motive, settings and suspects.

Spectacular Science - talking about the National Schools Science Fair in book two, 'School's Cancelled'. What kinds of experiments would the children find interesting to see? How wild and weird an experiment could we make?

Granny Trouble - the children can choose an activity: either come up with their own secret society, designing a logo and motto for it too, or alternatively, they can design their very own granny disguise!


















Wed 9th March - Jasbinder Bilan

Jasbinder Bilan, author of 'Asha & The Spirit Bird', 'Tamarind & the Star of Ishta' and 'Aarti & The Blue Gods' Years 4, 5 & 6, 09:30 & 11:00, 50 minute sessions. Up to 120 children (4 classes) per session.

In these interactive and visual events, former English teacher Jasbinder will talk about the themes of family, friendship, home, magic, mythology and resilience. She will begin by talking a little bit about herself, her childhood in both India and the UK, and her journey to writing her three books. She will then talk more in depth about her latest book, 'Aarti & The Blue Gods'. Jasbinder will read a short extract from Aarti and will split the session so children have a chance to do 3 Q&A sessions. She will show her map and challenge the children to create their own story map, so children should be prepared with plain A4 paper and a pencil. She aims to leave the children with lots of writing tips, engaged in the stories and inspired to pick up a book!

'Asha & The Spirit Bird' won the Costa Children's Book Award 2019 and 'Tamarind & The Star of Ishta' won the Indie Children's Book Award 2021.

Thurs 10th March - Maz Evans






